<p>YEARS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in 1998 <p>DECADES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the 1990s <p>CENTURIES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the 19th century <p>MONTHS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in January, in March,... <p>PARTS OF THE DAY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the morning in the afternoon in the evening <p>SEASONS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in (the) spring in (the) summer in (the) autumn in (the) winter <p>AFTER A CERTAIN PERIOD OF TIME</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in 10 minutes/in a while in a few days <ul style="list-style-type: none"> in the beginning in the end 	<p>DAYS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> on Monday, Tuesday,... on Monday morning on Friday night <p>DATES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> on the 7th May <p>PARTICULAR DAYS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> on my birthday on our anniversary on Christmas Day on New Year's Eve on New Year's Day on Independence Day <ul style="list-style-type: none"> on the weekend (US) 	<p>PRECISE TIME</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at 4 o'clock at the weekend/at weekends (UK) at the moment at the same time at present <p>SPECIAL EXPRESSIONS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at noon at night at midnight at lunchtime at dinnertime at bedtime at sunrise at sunset <p>HOLIDAYS (without "day")</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at Christmas at Easter <p>THE BEGINNING/THE END + of</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> at the beginning of January at the beginning of the film at the end of the month at the end of the film

There is **NO** preposition:

- with ***last, next, every, this.***

*I went to London **last** June.*

*He's coming back **next** Tuesday.*

*I go home **every** Easter.*

*We'll call you **this** evening.*

- with the words such as ***today, tonight, tomorrow, yesterday, the day after tomorrow, the day before yesterday.***
